

Rules and Regulations Washington Skeet Shooting Association

Article I. WSSA – hereby known as Washington State Skeet Association shall adhere to current rules and regulation set forth by the National Skeet Shooting Association.

Article II. Additional rules, qualifications, and/or regulations that pertain specifically to WSSA

1. WSSA – All-star team qualifications – said qualifications are not sanctioned by the NSSA but are rather offered by the WSSA as part of the current year skeet program.

WSSA High Average Teams

1. Must shoot the Washington state shoot.
2. Must shoot state minimums (500-12, 400 –20, 28 and 410)
3. 850 of the minimums must be shot in state.
4. Position on teams by 4-gun average:
 - a. All-State skeet team (Top 5 highest HOA averages)
 - b. Second Team (Next 5 highest HOA averages 6-10)
 - c. Honorable Mention (Highest HOA averages 11-15)

All-Star Team

1. Captain – Winner of HOA at the Washington American Skeet state shoot, no minimum target requirements
2. Classes – AA-E – based on 4-gun class at the beginning of the year being honored, using 4-gun average at the end of the year. Must shoot state minimums (500-12, 400 – 20, 28 and 410) and 850 of the minimums must be shot in state. Must shoot the Washington state shoot.
3. Most Improved – based on 4-gun averages previous year over year being honored. Must shoot the state shoot.
4. Rookie-Of-The-Year – based on 500 targets any combination. First time shooter. Must shoot the Washington state shoot. The average of all targets shot throughout the year will be used to select the shooter.
5. Lady – 500 any combination – highest average with 250 being shot in Washington state. Must shoot the Washington state shoot. The average of all targets shot throughout the year will be used to select the shooter.

6. Junior and Sub-Junior – 500 any combination - highest average with 250 being shot in Washington state. The average of all targets shot throughout the year will be used to select the shooter.
7. International – Winner of the Washington state international championships, no minimum target requirements.
2. Appreciation Award – Shall be chosen by the WSSA board. Awarded to a person, group or club that works hard for skeet in Washington State over a period of Time.
3. Hall of Fame - Individuals inducted are top shooters or long-term supporters of skeet in Washington State for a minimum of 12 years. A hall of fame committee is appointed each year at the general meeting

4. State Skeet Scholarship - Awarded to an individual(s) that have completed at least one quarter of college/trade school and meet the qualifications as put forth. Qualifications/Criteria available from any WSSA officer/club representative. Or, you can go to the following for further information:

5. Award location - The above awards are awarded at the annual Washington state shoot. Teams are based on the past years shooting. Other awards as eligible participants are selected.
